City Deal Monitoring

The City Deal provides the basis for New Anglia's skills agenda and while this work is now far wider and includes a range of Skills Funding Agency, EU components and employment projects this report will focus specifically on the asks and offers set out in the Deal.

 Provide a local data intelligence service for Labour Market Information. The development of the IAG activity is being led by Norfolk County Council, and supported by a range of partners, under the banner of Developing Norfolk's Future Workforce. This campaign was launched earlier in the year and provides a range of activity including:

- CPD events for teachers and careers guidance officers on the local economy
- Support for employer engagement in schools
- A range of resources for young people on pathways into employment including use of social media, videos etc
- Augmenting the resources available on Help You Choose
- Student Conventions in key economic sectors

This activity will continue into the new year with outcomes of activity being shared between Norfolk and Suffolk.

A data pack for the local economy, to be refreshed annually, has been produced and is available now on the LEP website. Alongside this work, data packs for each of the key economic sectors will also be produced over the coming year.

Employer Investment into Skills:

- Skills Deals for key sectors
- Employer Training Incentive

Negotiations are underway with the SFA to secure the funding to provide Skills Deals to support the local economy.

The Employer Training Incentive is being run through the Chambers of Commerce in Norfolk and Suffolk and funded through and Employer Ownership of Skills bid. The funding has been approved and is likely to become available over the coming months. We will work with a range of partners to ensure uptake in within the geography of the Greater Norwich City Deal.
